As the state's center of academic research and advanced studies, the Graduate School administers a more extensive and comprehensive program than any other educational institution in Louisiana.



Degree Information

We offer doctoral programs in over 50 major fields of study. These programs offer opportunities for advanced training and research in all areas of the sciences, social sciences, and humanities.

Master's degree programs are offered in 72 major fields (15 offered exclusively online). These range from Master of Fine Arts degrees in fields such as creative writing, studio art, and theatre, to professional degree programs in social work, business administration, and library and information science.

Graduate Certificates are available in 19 fields of study (11 offered exclusively online).

Student Advocacy & Accountability

This is accomplished through educational outreach, accountability meetings, university hearing panels, and behavioral interventions for individual students and student organizations.





<u>LSU Cares</u> is a university initiative dedicated to the wellbeing of students and promotion of a community that cares about each of its members.

LSU offers an <u>online reporting system</u> to help students, faculty, staff, families, and friends submit reports about:

- potential violations of the LSU Code of Student Conduct
- complaints or grievances
- concerns about students in crisis or distress.



Student Health Center

The mission of the Student Health Center (SHC) is to provide, promote, and support services that integrate individual health, education for health, prevention of disease, clinical treatment for illness, and public health responsibilities consistent with the educational mission of the University.

All full-time students pay the SHC fee, which is included as part of their tuition and fees. This allows full-time students to utilize most of the services the SHC offers, including mental health and counseling services from LSU Mental Health Services, at no additional charge.

Parking & Transportation

LSU offers a bus system, campus transit system, and parking permits. The bus service is available for students, faculty, staff, and visitors, both on and off campus on the LSU, and features global positioning devices to allow passengers to monitor actual arrival times through real time visualization.

The Tiger Card is the official LSU Identification card for all students, faculty, staff and affiliates. The card also serves as an electronic key for residence halls as well as the TigerCASH account. Student Financial Aid

You may sign up for a Meal Plan through your <u>myLSU</u> account. Once you are in your account, simply go to Registration Services, then Additional Services. Enter the corresponding Service Code for the Meal Plan you would like to choose. Meal Plan charges will be added to your Fee Bill if it is before the deadline for processing. Meal plans are not active until 24 hours after you are registered for classes.

LSU University Recreation (UREC) includes cardio and weight areas, personal training rooms, a climbing gym, gymnasium, classrooms, indoor pool, studios, indoor track, a challenge course, and more. Students can also get involved in intramural and club sports.

All currently enrolled, full-time LSU students are eligible to use LSU UREC by presenting their Tiger Card at the entry station. Part-time students are eligible to purchase a UREC membership at the current Student Rate.
